• 2010 Impact Factor for Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews: 6.186

The impact factor is a tool for ranking, evaluating, and comparing journals. It is a measure of the frequency with which the "average article" in a journal has been cited in a particular year. The 2010 Impact factor for the Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews (CDSR) is **6.186.** This is an increase on the 2009 Impact Factor which was 5.653 and the 4th consecutive year that the CDSR Impact Factor has increased. The CDSR is now ranked in the top 10 of the 151 in the Medicine, General and Internal category.

• Web-based Training on Impact Factor

Wiley–Blackwell will be hosting web-based training and telephone sessions (webinar) for Cochrane groups and entities to provide an overview of the bibliometric data available for the CDSR in 2010 and to answer any queries regarding the calculation and interpretation of the impact factor and associated metrics. SPREADING THE NEWS ABOUT COCHRANE SYSTEMATIC REVIEWS

Every Wednesday, the Department of Paediatrics, University of Calabar, holds in-house seminars on various issues relevant to paediatricians. Dr. Ekong Udoh (Senior Research Associate, Nigerian Branch of the South African Cochrane Centre) made a presentation on Study Designs and Systematic Reviews during one of such seminars held on the 18th of May 2011 at the Department of Paediatrics, University of Calabar Teaching Hospital.

A total of 26 medical doctors comprising house officers, registrars, senior registrars and consultant paediatricians were present. During the presentation, Dr. Udoh talked about the different kinds of study designs which he classified broadly under Descriptive and Experimental Study designs. Under Experimental Designs, he explained that Randomized



Controlled Trials were the Gold Standard. This led him to talk about systematic reviews. At the end of the seminar, he asked those who were interested in knowing more about Cochrane Systematic Reviews to contact the Nigerian Branch of the South African Cochrane Centre.
