- Name Change: Canadian Cochrane Centre The name of the Canadian Cochrane Network and Centre has been changed to Cochrane Canada and encompasses the work of Cochrane across the country. The centre will now be known as the Canadian Cochrane Centre.
- Three Cochrane Networks now fields: The Developing Countries Network, the Neurological Network and Nursing Care Network will now be known as Developing Countries Field, the Neurological Field and the Nursing Care Field respectively. This is to avoid confusion as the above Cochrane fields and other entities are also using the name network.

## Cochrane Consumer Workshop

The Nigeria Branch of the South African Cochrane Centre (NBofSACC) held a one-day Cochrane Consumer Workshop on the 21<sup>st</sup> of April 2010 at the Institute of Tropical Diseases Research and Prevention, University of Calabar Teaching Hospital, Calabar. This is one of the workshops being carried out under the Cochrane Opportunities Fund grant to make Cochrane information accessible to Nigerian Consumers.

Sixteen participants, comprising of key persons from civil society organizations involved in advocacy in the areas of HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria as well as direct consumers of health care services, attended the workshop.

During the workshop, Dr. Ekong Udoh (Paediatrician, University of Calabar teaching Hospital) gave a presentation titled 'Evidence Based Health Care – What is it?'. In this presentation he explained to the participants in simple terms, the meaning of evidence based health care and why it is so important. Other presentations included an 'Introduction to the Cochrane Collaboration' by Professor Meremikwu (Director, NBofSACC), 'Role of Consumers/Civil Society Organizations in Evidence Based Health Care' by Mr Felix Eke (administrative officer of the Branch) and 'Finding Evidence about Malaria, Tuberculosis and HIV in the Cochrane Library by Dr. Friday Odey (Paediatrician, University of Calabar Teaching Hospital). Participants also had the opportunity to practice searching the Cochrane Library for themselves during a hands-on-session.

In the last segment of the workshop, participants were divided into groups where they experimented with drama as a practical means of communicating evidence based health care information from the Cochrane Library.

The participants were excited about the workshop and all indicated that they would recommend it to their colleagues.
