- **Update on New Cochrane Register of Controlled Studies**

Oakleigh Consulting is making good progress in finalizing the user requirement and invitation to tender for the new Cochrane Register of Controlled Studies. It is hoped that the invitation to tender will be released by the Collaboration in early May 2009.

Research Methods and Statistics for the Health Sciences Workshop

Statistics can not be separated from research. After data has been collected, statistics play an important part in the interpretation and analysis of the data.

The Institute of Tropical Diseases Research and Prevention (ITDR&P), University of Calabar Teaching Hospital in collaboration with the Nigeria Branch of the South African Cochrane Centre (NBofSACC), and the Effective Health Care Research Programme (EHCAP) Nigeria held a 6-day workshop on 'Research Methods and Statistics for the Health Sciences' from the 16th-21st of March 2009. The workshop which took place at the Institutes' Conference Hall covered a variety of statistical topics. These included biostatistics, quantitative research methods, hands-on-training in statistical software (SPSS and Epi info) and research proposal development.

Resource persons included Dr. Samson Adebayo (PhD Biostatistics), Tunji Adeboye (World Health Organization), Professor Emmanuel Ezedinachi (Director, ITDR&P), Professor Martin Meremikwu (Director, NBofSACC), Dr. Angela Oyo-Ita (Department of Community Medicine, University of Calabar), Mr. I.E. Igiri (Federal College of Education Obudu) and Mr. O.N. Opie (Federal College of Education, Obudu).

The workshop drew together thirty-seven participants from various states/countries, some coming from as far as Ogun State in the West, and Cameroon. The participants also cut across age groups and various fields ranging from students in Public and Allied Health, to Officers in the Health Records Department (University of Calabar) and Doctors and Consultants from various medical specialties.

At the end of it all the participants indicated that they had learned a great deal from the workshop.

A Cochrane Review workshop was to have held back to back with the Statistics Course but could not take place as planned.

All about the Mentorship Programme

The Branch has recently initiated a mentorship programme. The programme is particularly important at this time because an increasing number of Nigerian authors require one-on-one assistance with their reviews. It takes advantage of the fact that the mentors and mentees are in the same locations and as such accessibility is much better. It also allows the Review authors receive one-on-one assistance tailored to their specific needs.



Up to five authors have been successfully paired with mentors and the pairing of others is still in progress. A number of experienced Cochrane Review Authors have been chosen to serve in the capacity of mentors. These include Dr. Afolabi Lesi, Dr. Bukola Fawole, Professor Martin Meremikwu, Dr. Angela Oyo-Ita, and Dr. Emmanuel Effa among others.

As more reviewers register titles, it is expected that, they will also be paired with mentors to give them more specific assistance. We believe that this will improve the completion and progress of reviews.

Every year, the Cochrane Collaboration makes available some stipends to assist Cochrane contributors/consumers or consumer advocates attend the Cochrane Colloquium. These stipends, namely the Developing Country Stipends and Consumer Stipends, are to help cover travel costs and some other expenses associated with attending the Colloquium.

The Developing Country Stipends is open to permanent residents in developing countries (according to World Bank definition) who have been contributing to the work of the Collaboration as review author, editor, trials search co-ordinator, Cochrane peer reviewer or co-ordinator of Cochrane activities locally.
